

LOUDONVILLE VILLAGE COUNCIL

June 3, 2019

The Loudonville Village Council met for a regular meeting on Monday, June 3, 2019 at 6 p.m. at the Loudonville Village Hall council chambers. Mayor Stricklen called the meeting to order and answering roll call were Mr. Bill Welsh, Mr. Tom Young, Mr. Michael Robinson, Mr. Jason Van Sickle, Mr. Tom Gallagher, and Mrs. Cathy Lance. Also in attendance at the meeting were Village Administrator Curt Young, Fiscal Officer Elaine Van Horn, Village Solicitor Thom Gilman, Fire Chief Mike Carey, Loudonville Planning Commission members Tom Motz and Carl Smith, L-P Schools Superintendent Catherine Puster, Loudonville Times Reporter Jim Brewer and Village residents Ashley Thurber, Ron & Kelly Fetzer, Wende Lance, Matt Young and Brandon Biddinger.

THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Stricklen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

CONSENT ITEMS:

Council Minutes – May 20, 2019 Regular Meeting: Councilman Welsh moved the minutes be approved as presented. Second by Councilwoman Lance. A roll call upon said motion resulted as follows:

First Energy Representative: Mr. Joe Jakubick, representing First Energy Regional External Affairs division, was present to introduce himself to the Mayor and Council. Mr. Jakubick reviewed the procedure to report a street light that is out, noting individuals can report them either online, by fax or by phone. Mr. Jakubick encouraged Council to contact him by phone should they ever have any concerns.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT REQUEST REVIEW: Council held a required hearing per Village Codified Ordinance 1254 to consider a request from Ron & Kelly Fetzer to build a home on property zoned R-2 CV. Upon question by Councilman Gallagher, Administrator Young noted that Chapter 1254 provides for a review by Council, noting that the Planning Commission was notified of the hearing per the regulations should they wish to comment on the request. Mayor Stricklen asked Planning Commission members Tom Motz and Carl Smith if they had any questions, comments or concerns, to which they replied they did not. There were no questions or comments by Council. Councilman Van Sickle moved to approve the Fetzer's request to build a home on County Road 529 in an area zoned R-2 CV. Second by Councilwoman Lance. A roll call upon said motion resulted as follows:

Mohican Bike Race: Chief Carey reported that University Hospitals again worked in collaboration with the Loudonville Fire Department/EMS to provide emergency medical assistance to the racers. Mayor Stricklen expressed appreciation to UH for their continued presence in the Village of Loudonville.
